Her work includes disputes concerning wills, trusts and estate administration, claims involving undue influence and lack of testamentary capacity, disputes regarding the duties of executors and trustees, and applications under the Inheritance (Provision for Family and Dependants) Act 1975.

Lauren's practice has further expanded to include Education, Adult Social Care, and Regulatory matters. She regularly accepts instructions from regulated entities, public bodies and educational institutions, providing both advocacy and advisory support.
